## **The Latest Breaking Chrysalis News**

One of the difficult times of life are the transition years, when we first leave our families and strike out to build our own adult lives. I think that I really stepped out far when I headed off to Germany for a few years. There are tremendous pressures and challenges that can cause young adults to stumble and lose their way, to lose sight of God and wander from His Church. But I am so thankful that I had a foundation in the Lord to handle the times when life felt a bit overwhelmed and foreign. I credit my parents for their many long years of showing and teaching me about God's love. And I credit the strengthening of my faith to Chrysalis and to God for setting me on life's road in the right direction. Experiencing God in such a powerful and personal way was indeed transforming. The Lord is truly "my strength and my song; He has become my salvation." Psalm 118:14

I am so thankful for the hundreds of individuals who sacrificed time and energy and responded to God's call to establish a Chrysalis community and serve on Flights and Journeys right here in this beautiful part of the world. I love coming back home to this safe and loving place.

Perhaps you are wondering what Chrysalis is all about. The Chrysalis is symbolic of a process of change that young adults are going through. It reminds us that we start like creatures who crawl through life with little meaning. But by God's Grace we are transformed into new creatures who fly to new heights in God's love and freedom. Thus, we have a Chrysalis Flight or Journey, a spiritually transforming experience that takes the young adult life-journey in a new direction through all of the next steps of their fourth days. The young adult Chrysalis Butterflies grow to understand their walk with Christ. What will God accomplish through them when He has their whole life?

The Chrysalis Flight is much like the Emmaus Walk except it is only open to high school sophomores, juniors and seniors. (Chrysalis Journeys are open to those ages 19-24.) There are a series of talks and discussions, inspiring worship, music, joy and fellowship..... and food! One difference is the inclusion of talks that focus on Christian living as a single person or in a married relationship. Another slight difference is the high energy and exuberance that typifies Chrysalis. And it's contagious! Fourth Day emphasis is similar to that of Emmaus, so that the Chrysalis Flight or Journey is a journey through life.

My Chrysalis experience has changed my life and there is no better way of traveling life's road with your best friend walking by your side, Jesus Christ. Wouldn't you like to send a young adult out into the world on the right road with the perfect best friend by their side? You can!

Why not decide to sponsor a young adult for the Chrysalis Flight. Think of your high school children, nieces and nephews, neighbors, and members of your church. 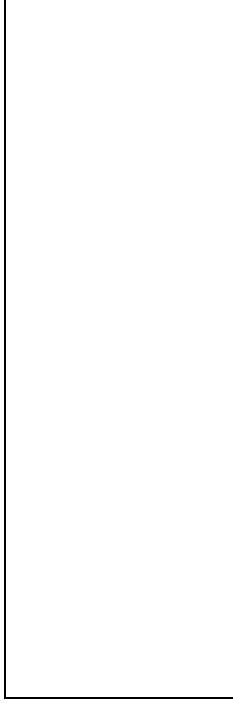
